Time Recycled

Time Recycled is a reintroduction of Kvadrat's acclaimed curtain, Time 300, with an improved composition and renewed colour palette by Aggebo & Henriksen.

Originally created by Erik Ole Jørgensen in 1987 and redesigned in 2006 by Aggebo & Henriksen, its latest iteration is plain woven with a high volume of recycled polyester. *Time Recycled* offers a matte surface and natural hand-feel, with a density that ensures both privacy and vibrancy. The recycled polyester yarns feature intricate irregularities, which are revealed as the curtain drapes in the light.

Time Recycled is yarn-dyed and features 22 delicate colourways, comprising warm and cold neutral tones, supplemented by vibrant shades of yellow and orange, alongside deep purples, and blues.

Inspired by the universal and poetic act of picking up a stone on the beach, Aggebo & Henriksen observed the variations in tonality and depth found when zooming in on wet stones. The duo recreated these tones in the weaving process, using one colour in the weft and another in the warp, to build a two-tone effect in each colourway.

Aggebo & Henriksen: "We love designing curtains because we get to collaborate with light. We look at the way that the light meets the threads and the colours and how this affects the atmosphere in the room. With Time Recycled, we want to bring the calming effect of the beach to any space in which the curtains are used."

Due to its recycled profile and soft expression, *Time Recycled* is suitable for both public and private spaces that seek to promote beauty, care, and wellbeing.
