

Lattice Hella Jongerius

Lattice

A flat rug with a refined houndstooth construction, Lattice's appeal lies both in the striking colour combinations of the weave and its endless potential for combination. It is hand woven using thick, woollen yarn bound together with a thin contrasting cotton.

The sophisticated, architectural constructution has a warmth to it, which is enhanced by a crisp, earthy colour palette. Natural irregularities that arise from the manual weaving process add soft, human dimension to an otherwise graphic design, as well as making each rug entirely unique.

Easily suited to many types of interiors, Lattice is a quiet yet intriguing and highly attractive contemporary design.

Hella Jongerius

Hella Jongerius is one of the world's foremost product designers. She is a prominent force in the Netherlands, her native country, as well as on the international stage where she wins regular accolades for her thoughtful and research-driven work. Since her early work for Dutch design collective Droog, and now at her Berlin-based studio Jongeriuslab, material and process research largely determines her design direction. Her work has been characterised by a unique ability to approach industry with a craft perspective. In 2013 Hella Jongerius was appointed Design Director for Kvadrat and Maharam's Amsterdam based rug atelier, she has brought that same craft sensibility, research and experimentation to the textile industry.

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
