

Drops Acoustic

Designed by Patricia Urquiola, *Drops Acoustic* is an airy sheer, which makes it exceptional for an acoustic curtain. It features a pattern of woven drops that emerge from stripes and flow over its surface.

Characterised by tactility and an elegant interplay of colours, *Drops Acoustic* is crafted with a special tape yarn that closes the weave. This construction enables the curtain to deliver up to Class D sound absorption when draped, while still allowing in plenty of light.

Drops Acoustic comes in 10 subtle colourways. When viewed from different angles or draped, the curtain creates subtle yet striking nuances. The colour of the background also appears to change depending on the way the stripes combine colours.

Spanish architect and designer Patricia Urquiola was born in Oviedo, and attended the School of Architecture of Madrid Polytechnic and Milan Politechnic. She lives and works in Milan.
